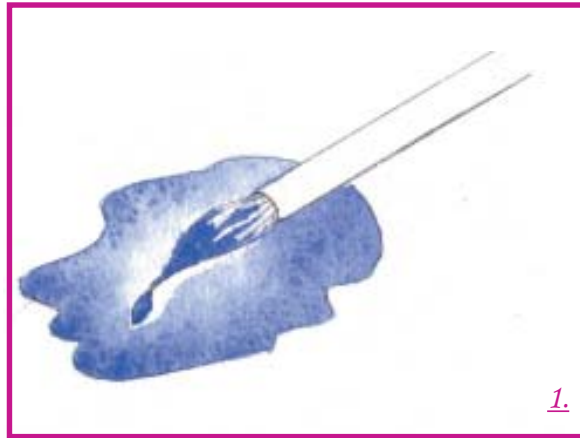
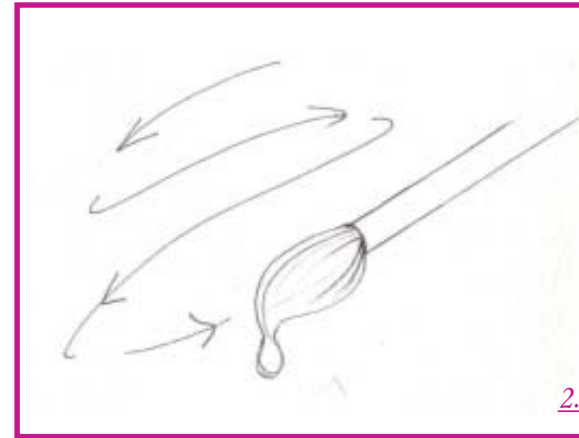


Paint a Sky in 4 Easy Steps www.beemorrison.co.uk

1. Getting Ready . . . use a medium brush to make a large watery Ultramarine puddle . . . leave the brush in the puddle ready to use later . . . experiment with the strength or weakness of this coloured puddle . . .



2. Wetting the Paper . . . use the second medium brush to wet the paper all over . . . tip the paper to gather the excess water in one corner . . . use a paper towel to absorb the excess . . .



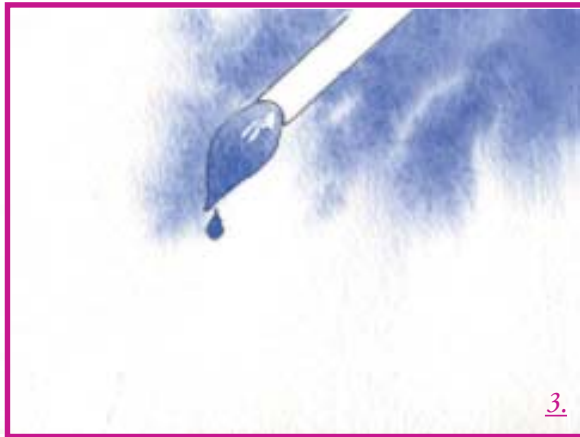

About Paper Wetness . . . wet paper has various stages of wetness . . . it will look quite shiny when it is very wet . . . as the paper starts to dry it will look matt . . .

Dabbing Techniques . . . a loaded brush will release its colour more readily by dabbing it on the paper wetness . . .



3. Adding the Sky Colour . . . whilst the paper is still wet . . . use the brush loaded with Ultramarine to dab the colour at the top . . . then tilt carefully to allow the colours to run across the paper . . .



4. Controlling the Colour . . . flatten the paper to stop the colour running too far into the picture . . . collect the excess in a corner with a paper towel . . .
